If you have an item and you are not sure if it is hazardous, read the label. If there are cautionary statements that read: WARNING, POISON, CAUTION, HARMFUL, CAUSTIC, FLAMMABLE, EXPLOSIVE, IRRITANT, or HAZARDOUS then the waste should be treated as hazardous waste.

PLEASE BE SURE THAT ALL WASTE IS IN A SEALED CONTAINER. Original containers are best.

What NOT to Bring:

Empty containers such as paint cans and cleaning bottles

Non-household hazardous waste

Radioactive wastes (e.g. smoke detectors)

Explosives

Ammunition

Asbestos
